ABOUT CORA

MISSION: To Create Enabling Environment for the Flourishing of the Contemporary Arts of Nigeria & the Continent.

VISION: To Make Art & Culture the Prime Destination for Investment in Nigeria and Africa.

DEFINITION: We Are 'Cultural Landscapists.'

CORA is Winner of the Prince Claus Award, 2006.

History: The **Committee for Relevant Art (CORA)** came to life on June 2, 1991. It's a culture activist organisation with the agenda to facilitate creation of an enabling environment for the flourishing of the contemporary arts of Nigeria, in the forms of Literature, Theatre, Fine Art, Music, Movie as well as TV Programme Design and Production.

In the past three decades, CORA has been at the forefront of championing the major issues that have shaped – directly or otherwise – the cultural landscape of Nigeria. Some of the most forward-looking initiatives in the Nigerian culture environment have come out of CORA-organised forums.

CORA has carried out its intermediation role through the vehicle of its various programmes, projects and activities, including the following:

- > ARTS STAMPEDE (quarterly since 1991)
- ➤ **LABAF** (annually since 1999)
- > ARTHOUSE FORUM (periodic since 2005)
- ➤ LAGOS CINEMA CARNIVAL (on rest)
- ➤ LAGOS THE CITYARTS GUIDE (on rest)

CORA also convenes regular sessions of *Lagos Circle of Critics; Culture Working Committee; Lagos Peppersoup Elites; Coalition of Nigerian Artists, CONA* etc - These are special purpose vehicles (SPV) through which it accomplishes its broader objectives.

CORA is in relationship with Artists organisations/Associations and agencies within the culture bureaucracies; and periodically stages collaborative projects with these institutions.



ABOUT LABAF

AUNCHED in September 1999, LABAF is a 24-year-old comprehensive week-long culture picnic. It features reading sessions, conversations around 'content and context of books', art and craft displays, children/students art workshops, Publishers-Booksellers-Writers-Readers' Forum, Writers' workshops, Book Trek, Book exhibitions, Drama skits, Live music, Poetry and Dance performances, among other items. Anything and everything happen at LABAF-the feast of LIFE and IDEAS.

Essentially, however, it is an ART festival with high BOOK content.

ABAF has over the years transformed from a Literary Festival to being a campaign for LITERACY – stressing on EDUCATION (knowledge acquisition which leads to mental capacitation), that guarantees ENLIGHTENMENT and ultimately leads to EMPOWERMENT that ensures active participation of the citizenry in discourses around the social, political, economic and cultural affairs of the nation, and the world by extension.

All of this is premised on tapping into the instrumentality of ARTS and CULTURE production and expression to deepen CIVIC engagement.

To this effect, the programming content at LABAF goes beyond creative writings and arts/craft materials to embrace non-fiction and other such cultural projects relevant to the theme of each edition.

ABAF in past decade and half has also gradually rebranded from being a project solely organised by CORA, to becoming a platform for other content producers to stage their events, or accomplish their projects. These are branded Partners, or Collaborators. Hence most of the events listed in the programme outline are by other producers who use the LABAF platform.

In fulfilment of CORA's desire, many other festivals – literary and cultural – have also grown out of the LABAF platform and flowering in their own distinct form and character, but essentially using the LABAF's template of committed and resilient operations to stay the course. This is thus fulfilling the CORA oft-expressed dream of ultimately having a culture festival in every city of the country and Africa, by extension.



LABAF 2022 PATHWAYS TO THE FUTURE







EDUCATION. LITERACY. EMPOWERMENT Saving our Humanity

The LABAF Programme Manifesto

SINCE its inspired birth in September 1999 to herald the birth of democratic governance in Nigeria, the preoccupation of the **Committee for Relevant Art, CORA**, and its prime Literary project, the *LAGOS BOOK & ART FESTIVAL, LABAF*, has been the desire to create the space for every member of the human family to be a dignified member of the community in which s/he finds him/herself.

The core of our very VISION and MISSION at the CORA, therefore, is the protection, and implicitly, the sustenance and survival of our/the human race. We insist that *No Human is greater than the Other*. All are created equal, except where extraneous circumstances dictate that some are better-privileged than the others; and so, such could exploit the advantage (often pecuniary) to oppress the non-so-privileged.

Essentially, the first instrument of oppression of the 'lowly' by the socalled High and Mighty is the hording of such essential civilising tools as:

- > EDUCATION which ensures that important information circulates to all;
- ENLIGHTENMENT which makes everyone to be aware of situations/circumstances in their environment

EMPOWERMENT (mental and economical) - which ensures that everyone is capacitated to be able to fully explore his/her potentials, and exploit same for self/benefit and mutual benefit of his/her family and the community.

The CORA insists that what the community of Humans needs is the flourishing and flowering of LITERACY to/and among every member of the Human family; so, they are well-resourced to participate effectively in the conversations that affect their common interest; and the general wellbeing of the society.

Education is thus the way to deepen democratic values and guarantee that all will be effective participants in decision making processes that lead to collective good, and better nationhood.

This is why we insist on an open-air *feast* of IDEAS and LIFE, where every member of the community is a partaker; and an active actor in the socialisation process.

This is the creed of our engagement at the programming directorate of the LABAF, which is running into its quarter of a century anniversary on a blaze of glory.

EDUCATION. ENLIGHTENMENT. EMPOWERMENT

THIS combo cocktail is what the *Lagos Book & Art Festival* is all about. These are the virtues that the grand "festival of ideas and life" has pursued since 1999, when its birth was instigated by the desire to help prepare the Nigeria citizenry for then impending era of political freedom... a relief from decades of wastefulness by the vagabonds in warrior attire.

The LABAF was born out of a desire to help facilitate the rise of the 'intellect' over 'emotion' in the affairs of peoples of our nation.

The LABAF signposts its mission with the dream to help deepen human capital development in the continent through a systematic and schematic spread of enlightenment through the written, painted, sculpted, crafted or spoken texts... that educate, enlighten, empower and develop the mind... all about erasing ignorance from the mind of men... eroding their powerlessness... wearing off their hopelessness in the capability of goodness to always *trump* the evil.






